Both physically safe places and emotionally safe people are necessary.

- Would youth rate my space as safe & accessible?
- Which people are youth most drawn to?
- How might we ensure that all employees have their core qualities?

Go where youth are and go with people who have street cred.

- Is your outreach plan informed by a range of stakeholders?
- What are people saying about you?
- How can you ensure that the message about your organization is consistent with its mission?

Programs must have multilevel benefits.

- Are we clear on the needs of our clients?
- To what extent are my services aligning with the varying needs of our clients?
- In what ways might we work with our clients to better tailor our offerings?

Who leads is as important as what is taught.

- What characteristics are most important to our clients when seeking services?
- What training will help our staff to identify their positionality and capacity?
- How might we align hiring procedures to ensure we have the optimal people for each position?
