# **Better Together**


Phase 2 Findings

#### Project Goals & Overview

**Better Together** is a multiphase research project designed to **prevent early substance use** among Black youth exposed to household challenges. In Phase 2, we conducted focus groups with **young people, parents,** and **library staff** to assess the acceptability of a library-based substance use prevention intervention. This work is led by Dr. Terrinieka Powell and is funded by the Bloomberg American Health Initiative.

# FOCUS GROUPS DEMOGRAPHICS (N=24)

Focus groups were conducted with 9 young people, 6 parents and 9 library staff.



### **RESULTS**

## This study highlighted the following:

Strengths-focused narrative

"I like how there's a sense of like they're not bad people. They're troubled people. They have their own trauma. They have their history."

Positive coping strategies

"I like the idea of sensory objects to take out your emotions like maybe give them a little squeaky toy one...Something to take home."

Age-appropriate messaging

"I love the framing of body, heart, and time. I think that's clear and relatable...It's something that I can hear a teen saying that and owning that." Interactive games

"I think the game of telephone would be really fun. I think they'll enjoy that."

#### **Next Steps**

We are revising the **library-based intervention**, based on focus group feedback, to prevent early substance use among youth exposed to household challenges. We are partnering with Cleos Studios to **animate** the central stories. We will **partner with local and school libraries** to deliver the intervention to middle school students.
